There is a need at the newly opened Hope4Recovery house in Berlin for toiletries for the 12 men that have moved in there. So please support this only recovery house in Worcester



In Memory of David Thomas Rouch



Dave was called home on September 24, 2018 at the age of 78 after a courageous battle with cancer.

He combined his love of travel and engineering with service in the United States Air Force, maintaining airborne navigation radar systems after which followed a distinguished 32-year career at the National Security Agency and several years of work at Harris Corporation. He insisted to anyone who asked that all he did all day was trade baseball cards and chew bubblegum.

Dave will be remembered for his analytical mind, lightning wit, ferocious sense of humor, steadfast faith, and beautiful voice.

He delighted in telling his family that donuts were God's perfect food, that "Monster Mash" is early rap music canon, that Star Trek, Star Wars, and Schwarzenegger deserved reverence, and that he was the best at pancakes and spaghetti sauce.

There was no viewing as his wife of 49 years, Patricia, refused to honor his request to be lashed to a wooden raft and set ablaze on the open ocean at sunset, Viking-style. Instead, a celebration of his life took place at Buckingham Presbyterian Church in Berlin, where he was a church and choir member for eighteen years. Per his request, his ashes were placed in a "Chock Full o' Nuts" can.


He will be remembered lovingly by all who knew him. He lived long and prospered!
