

"S'more time with Jesus" & Children's Ministries Keep Expanding

Friends, I want to tell you some exciting news: God is using <u>your church</u> to touch people's lives! And I don't say that lightly. What an exciting time to be a Buckingham member. What a privilege to be here right now.

This last Sunday during services people were raving about how fun "Trunk-n-Treat" was on Friday, October 25th. The costumes were great and maybe 200 people participated. I'm so glad things turned out so well. I've heard we will hold that event again next year.

Our "S'more Time with Jesus" events run by Elders Lindsay Ashton and Cindi Pruitt are helping us reach out to our community. On Friday, Oct. 5^{th} , the church held a "S'more Time with Jesus" and 75 adults and kids came out. We had so many people come we almost ran out of food! And then two days later, Oct. 7^{th} , we saw a bunch of new people come to services. We had at least 5 families visit us who had never come before to our church. We had around 70-75 people in worship, 20 of those in the Kid's classes. Our new teenage class for 12 and 13-year-olds had six students. After the first service, the kids continued to play in the Sunday school rooms, Taylor Hall, and the parking lot where we have a new basketball hoop installed. While the kids played, the parents caught up with one another during an extended fellowship hour.

Days like the ones I've described above are a dream come true, an answer to prayer. When kids are bringing their parents to church, that's the sign of the Holy Spirit moving in your midst. When volunteers are organizing kid's events, that's a sign people are responding to the call of Jesus to serve others. When kids and parents stay a long time after church to play and talk, you know your church excels at hospitality. Buckingham is a very special community, and you are a part of its growth and spirit of love!

<u>Classes for Middle and High Schoolers</u>

In addition to children's ministries, our classes for older kids keep expanding too. We continue to offer a Sunday school class for 6-9th graders, and we have several students taking our confirmation class on Sunday nights. One parent told me she wanted to contact families with older high school students so they could first help with the younger class and then, eventually, start their own class. It would be great to sponsor an older high school class.

Developing Musical Opportunities for Children and Youth

If you had a chance to experience the "Songs of America" concert on Sunday, October 20th, you undoubtedly had a great time. The Soloists and the Worchester Prep School youth choir were inspiring with their secular and sacred songs of the Revolutionary-Era. The costumes from the 1770s was the best. Someone commented to me that they thought it was great to see kids sing hymns in a choir. We thank Lynne Murray for her leadership in putting together the concert for the community. Many new people found out about Buckingham through the concert. We hope to develop more relationships with music-lovers in our area. Music and song have always been a valued part of the Christian tradition.

A Note from Historian Lynne Murray

Dear Church Friends,

Please indulge me for again deviating from my assignment of writing an historical article. I must tell you about the October 20 Vocal Concert and thank the many people who worked to make it a success. I was pleased to welcome the audience from the pulpit and although I've addressed the congregation from the sanctuary floor I found that to be a daunting and inspiring experience!

First on the agenda was classically trained soprano **Kristin Jones**, accompanied by pianist **Kathleen Rhodes**. Both ladies were attired in authentic colonial costume with Kristin as a lady in a polonaise, or draped skirt style. Kathleen was dressed as Continental soldier, Deborah Sampson, whose identity as a woman wasn't discovered until she was wounded and taken to a hospital. Kathleen shared with us the history of each tune, that included songs popular in the colonies during the American Revolution.

Following the intermission, Worcester Preparatory School Music Director **Christopher Buzby** opened the second part of the program. Buzby grew up singing with the Philadelphia Boy's Choir and had participated in programs that included tenor Luciana Pavarotti. Twenty-two young men and women in the WPS Vocal Ensemble, attired in their school blazers, performed in the choir loft to the accompaniment of recorded instrumental background music. Their selections included American favorites such as Danny Boy, Shenandoah, and Build Me Up Buttercup. The Vocal Ensemble concluded their program with The Star Spangled Banner, to which the inspired audience joined in.



Kathleen Rhodes, a church organist for over fifty years, closed the musical portion of the program with a rousing rendition of *Stars and Stripes Forever* on our new Rodgers organ.

Reverend **Glenn Zuber** spoke briefly to the audience about the history of Buckingham and invited everyone to attend the reception in Taylor Hall.

The patriotic theme of the event was reflected in the fresh flowers, donated by **Susan Cropper**, for the sanctuary and the buffet table in the Hall. Serving pieces for the buffet were red, blue, and silver, offering coconut macaroons, vanilla meringues, and several varieties of cookies and pastries. Candies included red and blue gumballs and red, white, and blue M&M's. Red striped treat bags were available for carry-out.

I owe a sincere thanks to so many. Thanks to Rev. Glenn for his support and interest. Monthly we feed those in transition at the Samaritan's Shelter in Pocomoke City. This month we served dinner for adults and three children. Many of the residents are in transition as they work and reside there until they can get their own housing. In addition to a scrumptious meal and dessert, we were able to give the children pillows and books.



They were thrilled. The residents are always grateful for the meals we serve, paper products we provide and great conversation. We have asked a representative from the shelter to speak at our December 8 BPC church service to familiarize our congregation on their facility and mission focus. This will enable everyone to be fully aware when we support them through our Angel and Hearts tree at Christmas time. We serve meals on the third Thursday of each month. If you are interested in joining us, let Nance Hall know or sign up on the sheet located on the Volunteer board.

In addition to Samaritan's Shelter, we continue to assist Worcester County residents in need with rent and utility assistance. We provide support through donations to the Spirit Kitchen and will be working closely with our local elementary schools to sponsor Student of the Month programs, Ice cream days, sponsorship of a family for Thanksgiving, as well as collect much needed items such as socks and school supplies. In the future you will hear more about the installation of a Blessing Box and a Giving Tree at our church that will enable us to collect much needed clothes, food and living essentials for schools and those in need. Collecting proactively will allow us to be quicker in satisfying needs in our community with improved efficiency. Stay tuned as we provide more details on these projects.
